

# What is Work and Travel?

Work and Travel (WaT) is a legal and cultural student exchange program organized by the U.S. Government, that allows college student to work in the USA during summer, to save money and travel, thereby allowing them to get to know themselves better and to get acquainted with foreign cultures. Students participating in Work and Travel program organized between the dates of May 15 and October 30 every year obtain J-1 visa and have the opportunity to work and live in the US for 4 months. The job that the student will work in the the payment he/she will receive in return will be determined before the student depart for the U.S.A. This particular aspect renders Work and Travel (WaT) a program that pays for itself.

Students who have legal work permit between the dates of May 15 and September 30 also have the right to be present as well as the right to roam in USA for 1 month as of the date when they quit the job they were working in. For instance, a student who quit his/her job on September 30th has the right to be in the USA until October 30th, whereas a student who quit his/her job on September 5th has the right to be present in the USA until October 5th. Starting and ending dates of employment are determined by taking students' academic calendars in to consideration and in line with the preferences of the employer.

## What actually Work and Travel is not?

The Work and Travel Program is not just a career development program and it is certainly NOT a tour/organization, camping or a vacation program catered for students. Work and Travel Program should not be considered as an entertainment program or a program that allows you to make money. Work and Travel is a program that involves entirety of these aspects all together.

## What are the advantages of the Work and Travel Program?

**Work and Travel Program allows you;**

- to make friends with your peers who join the program from different countries,
- to gain confidence to express yourself freely in English.
- to make money by working in the USA.
- to see colleges that you want to attend for master's and doctoral programs up close and to get the chance to evaluate them.



### Who can participate in the Work and Travel Program?

- Students who are between the ages of 18-29 / and whose English is at least in intermediate level,
- students who continue their education in prep, first, second, third and final year of universities providing 4-year-education
- Prep Class, First year Master's Program
- Students and Doctoral Students who do not exceed the age limit,
- Students of foreign nations who continue their education in Turkey and who fulfil the first three conditions given above.

## Working Hours and Income

Participants are given the opportunity to work 32-40 hours in average per week. Hourly fees vary between \$8-\$15 in average. Monthly average income is around \$1500-\$2000. Participants who are willing to work in more than one job can do so in a manner in which weekly working hours for their first employer do not interfere with the second and even the third job and thus, they can increase their monthly average income up to \$2500-\$3000 easily.

While your English level, your school's closing dates and states that you want to go are considered in job placements, available job options and quotas are also determinative.

## How will I be placed in to a job?

Officials of Human Resources Departments in companies located in the USA introduce and advertise their companies as well as their job options. You can have the chance to meet your employer in person by attending to job fair! You can attend job fairs organized by CampusEdu in January - February every year and they are even free of charge! We recommend people who are planning to attend with their friends' group to follow job fairs and dates closely. For employers and students who cannot attend to job fairs, Skype interviews are conducted in CampusEdu office at various times throughout the year. No matter where they are located, students who are willing, can join these Skype interviews to have a chat with American employers.

## Accommodation

Many of the employers offer accommodation options in return for a fee that you can pay with your own income on a weekly basis. CampusEdu consultants offer guidance to students in terms of accommodation with USA-based sponsor companies in cases where your employer does not provide accommodation. Accommodation options include shared houses, hotels/motels or dormitory type accommodation.

## What is CEO (CampusEduOnline) Account?

CEO (CampusEduOnline) is an online portal that allows CampusEdu subscribers to keep track of operations regarding Work and Travel Program and that enables every registered student to upload necessary documents. CEO accelerates and facilitates processes for students and consultants alike. Students can upload necessary documents to their profiles all at once instead of sending their documents by courier or handing them over directly at the office.

Using CEO allows you;

to watch and track Work and Travel processes and procedures online,  
to upload your documents to your account without paying courier fees for delivering your documents to us or without bringing them directly to our office,  
to get informed about subjects such as your job placement, visa interview etc. by means of informative e-mails automatically sent over CEO in every process stage.



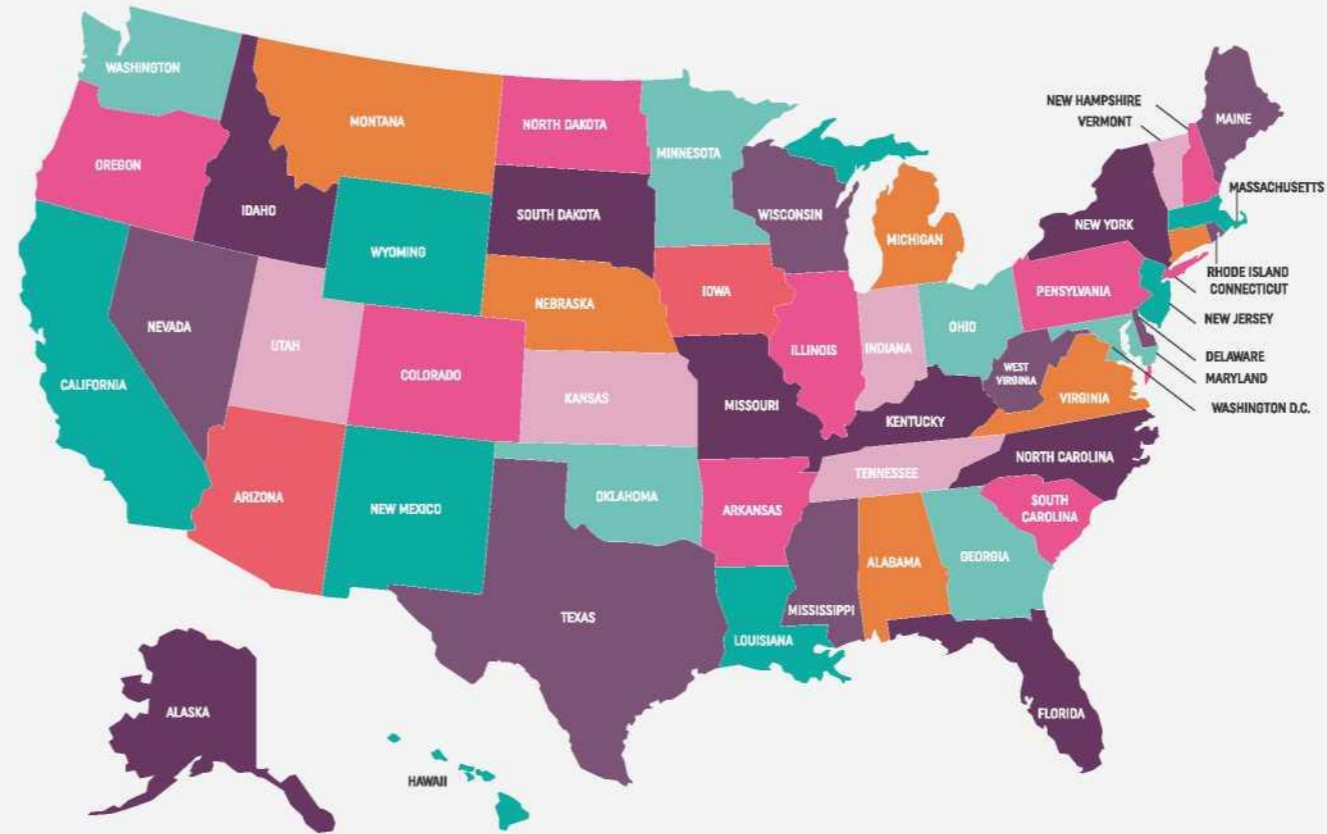
## Step-By-Step Application Stages

1. Students who are accepted to the program signs Work and Travel participation agreement and pays for the final registration fee.
2. Documents requested from the student in the stage of final registration are delivered to CampusEdu in 15 days at the latest.
3. Students choose the most fitting job in company with experienced CampusEdu consultants who previously participated in Work and Travel Program and conduct an interview with their employers.
4. Students who are hired by an employer are then provided an Employment Agreement Form/Job Offer Form.
5. Subsequently, students who signed the abovementioned Employment Agreement Form/Job Offer Form make the rest of the payment and commence the preparations for visa procedures.
6. CampusEdu has DS 2019 Form (This form is an official document that is approved by the U.S. Government and that allows participants to work legally in USA throughout the program) drafted on behalf of the participant from the USA.
7. When the DS 2019 Form arrives, participant becomes ready for visa procedures.
8. Participants will be informed about visa interviews in Visa Seminar to be organized by CampusEdu. CampusEdu will make an appointment on participants' behalf and subsequently participants apply for a visa.
9. CampusEdu provides consultancy services in terms of plane tickets for participants' travel plans.
10. In the orientation activity to be organized by CampusEdu prior to departure for the USA, participants will be informed in detail about living and working conditions in the USA.

## How can I register if I am out of town / without coming to your office?

Work and Travel is not a program that requires you to pay frequent visits to our office thanks to our CampusEduOnline (CEO) portal. After participants send us the original signed copy of Program Participation Agreement by courier which is a one-time only request, our process of looking for a job for participants begins. Once we found a suitable job for our participants, we have the DS 2019 Form which is participants' legal working permit brought to our office and we deliver this official document to our participants. CampusEdu consultants remain in constant contact with participants in every stage of the Program and identically, our participants can follow all of their procedures no matter where they are located in Turkey by using our CEO portal.

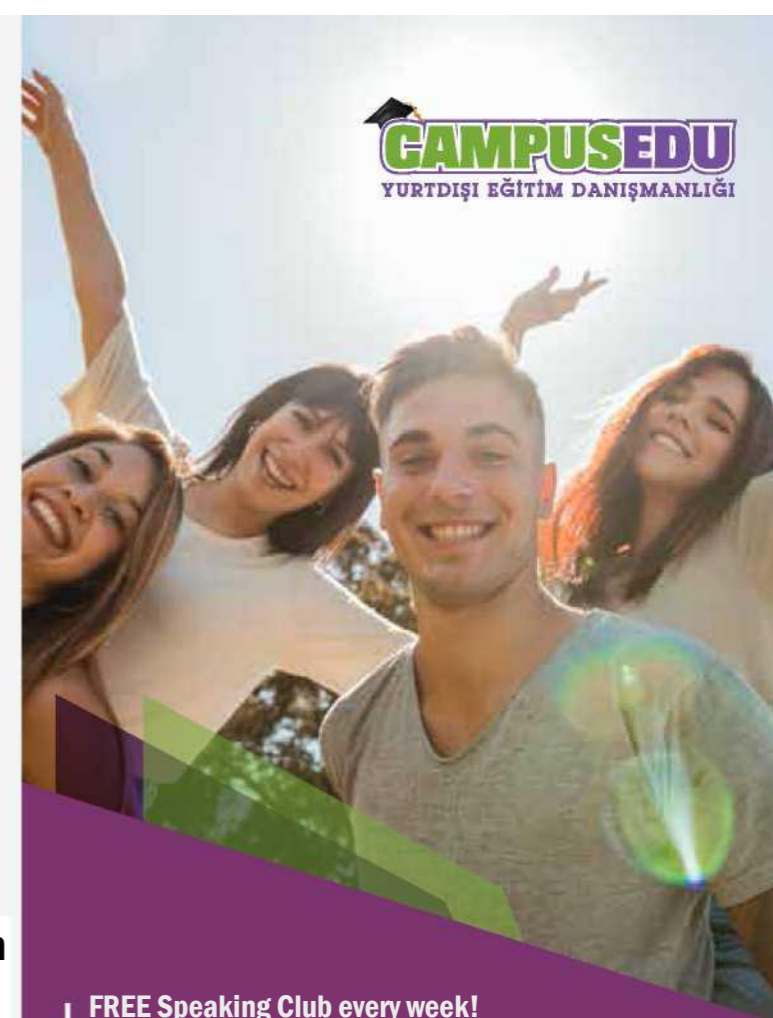
